Have you ever heard of Kane Tanaka? She was the second-oldest person ever recorded, and she died on April 19th, 2022, at the age of 119 years and 107 days. At the time of her death, she was the oldest living person in the world.

(A) Born in 1903, Tanaka married a rice shop owner at the age of 19, and worked in the family store until she was 103. She worked longer than most people live! She survived two world wars, two pandemics and two cases of cancer. Until her death, she had been living in a nursing home in Fukuoka and kept her mind in good condition by doing math problems and remaining curious.

She was a super-centenarian, which means that she lived to be over 110 years old. (B) Only about two in a hundred thousand women, or two in a million men can live long enough to become super-centenarians. In fact, only one in a thousand centenarians can live this long. Did you know that when a super-centenarian becomes 114 years and 28 days old, he or she would have lived about one million hours of life? A study says that the USA, Japan, France, UK and Italy are the top 5 countries with the most super-centenarians. There are thought to be between 300 and 450 supercentenarians living now.

Japan will probably become the super-centenarian champion again soon, and it will probably be a woman. Japanese government statistics² released in 2020 showed that women have a life expectancy³ of almost 87.5 years. In the same year, one in every 1,565 people in Japan was over 100 years old and almost 90% of them were women. Live in Japan, more than, living around the world, according to the United Nations, and 79,000, half a million centenarians, there are, So, do you want to be a super-centenarian? If so, you'd better eat your vegetables and exercise your brain and body.
